NOTICE OF AVAILABILITY

An Environmental Assessment titled, Garden of Eden Drainage District – Section 2, Item No. 139S2, Non –Federal, Emergency Levee Rehabilitation Project, and a draft Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) prepared by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Kansas City, are available for your review on the project's website at: [http:// www.nwk.usace.army.mil](http://www.nwk.usace.army.mil).

The Kansas City District – U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (CENWK), in cooperation with the project sponsor, Garden of Eden Drainage District – Section 2 proposes to construct the Garden of Eden – Section 2 Levee Rehabilitation Project under the authority of Public Law 84-99, of the Flood Control Act of 1944. Under this authority, the Corps of Engineers can provide assistance to public agencies in responding to flood emergencies such as the rehabilitation of flood control works damaged or destroyed by floods.

The project area is located in Chariton County, Missouri along the left descending bank of the Grand River, between river miles 22.0 to 15.5. The proposed project would involve in-place repair of a severe landside slides, and repair of the severe riverside/foreshore area erosion, with an approximate 1,212-linear-foot-long landward levee setback. Repairs are required as a result of the flood event declared on 6 May 2007.
