



# 2013 Harlan County Lake Waterfowl Blind Locations



Blind Markers are 6' Orange Lathe Stakes and may not be easily accessed from shore.  
 Boundary Circles Around Each Permanent Blind Site Represent 500 Yards. No Temporary Blinds, Including Boat Blinds, May Be Within This Boundary While A Permanent Blind Is Occupied.  
 Persons issued waterfowl blind permits shall have first priority for the use of that blind site. However, if the blind is unoccupied at legal shooting time (30 min prior to sunrise) it shall be available for use by any and all hunters. Permit holders lose their priority if they are not at the blind site by legal shooting time.

## CONDITIONS OF PERMIT

- This permit is granted solely for the purpose described by the permittee on the Lakeshore Use Permit.
- The permittee agrees to, and does hereby release and agree to, save and hold the Government harmless from any and all causes of action, suits at law or equity, or claims or demands or from any liability of any nature whatsoever for or on account of any damages to persons or property, including the permitted facility, growing out of the ownership, construction, operation or maintenance by the permittee of the permitted facility.
- No attempt shall be made by the permitted to forbid the full and free use by the public of all navigable waters at or adjacent to the permitted facility or to unreasonably interfere with navigation in connection with the ownership, construction, operation or maintenance of the permitted facility.
- The permitted agrees that if subsequent operations by the Government require an alteration in the location of the permitted facility or if the permitted facility shall cause unreasonable obstruction to navigation or that the public interest so requires, the permittee shall be required to remove, alter, or relocate the permitted facility, without expense to the Government.
- The Government shall in no case be liable for any damage or injury to the permitted facility, which may be caused by, or result from subsequent operations undertaken by the Government for the improvement of the navigation or for other lawful purposes, and no claims or right to compensation shall accrue from any such damage.
- The ownership, construction, operation, and maintenance of the permitted facility are subject to all applicable Federal, State, and local laws and regulations.
- This permit does not convey any property rights either in real estate or material; and does not authorize any injury to private property or invasion of private rights or any infringement of Federal, State or local laws or regulations.
- The permittee shall comply promptly with any lawful regulations or instruction of any Federal, State or local agency of the Government.
- Upon expiration of this permit, or upon revocation of this permit, the permittee shall remove the permitted facility within 30 days, at his expense, and restore the waterway and lands to their former condition. If the permittee fails to remove and so restore to a satisfactory state, the Project Manager may do so by contract or otherwise and recover the cost thereof from the permittee.
- No charge may be made for use by others of the permitted neither facility nor commercial activity be engaged therein.
- Floation units of floating facilities shall be constructed of materials that will not become waterlogged or sink when punctured.
- Floating structures are subject to periodic inspection by Corps rangers. If any inspection reveals conditions, which make the facility unsafe in any way, the owner upon receipt of notification will correct such conditions immediately.
- Floating facilities shall be anchored to the shore by means of moorings, which do not obstruct the free use of the lakeshore.
- No vegetation may be damaged, destroyed, MOWED, or removed. No vegetation planting of any kind may be done.
- No change in landform, such as grading, excavation or filling may be done.
- This permit is non-transferable. Upon the sale or other transfer of the permitted facility or the death of the permittee, this permit is null and void.
- Blinds locations are placed no closer than 300 yards and permit holders may not move the blind stake unless written permission is obtained by the USACE at Harlan County Lake.
- Blinds must be in place by 15 October 2013 and removed within 30 days of the end of the 2013-2014 fall and winter hunting season. Blinds may not remain for the Spring Conservation Snow Goose season.
- No pit blinds may be constructed on government lands.
- Legal shooting time is 30 minutes before sunrise.
- Persons issued this permit shall have first priority for the use of their permitted blind site. However, if the blind is unoccupied by the permit holder at legal shooting time (30 min prior to sunrise) it shall be available for use by any and all hunters. Permit holders lose priority if they are not at their blind site by legal shooting time.
- Persons issued this permit may not hunt out of an adjoining boat blind and prohibit the use of the permanently permitted blind location. If the permanent blind structure that is constructed by October 15, 2013 is not occupied at legal shooting time it shall be available for use by any and all hunters.
- Blinds may not be permanently locked. A secure lock box or storage area within the blind may be locked. Blinds are open for public access.
- Portable blinds, which include boat blinds, are put out and removed daily and do not require a permit. Portable blinds must stay 500 yards from all permitted blinds. However, if the permitted blind is unoccupied by the permit holder at legal shooting time temporary blinds may hunt within the 500 yard limit.
- Vehicles are not permitted off authorized roadways or trails at any time, unless specified in this permit. Operating a vehicle off roads may be punishable by the issuance of a citation and the revocation of the duck blind permit.
- ATV access will be allowed for duck blind construction, hunting access, and removal from 15-September-2013 to 31-Jan-2014. The closest, most direct route from public access along the exposed shoreline to the blind is permitted. Indiscriminate driving off exposed shoreline or those paths not directly to and from the permitted route is strictly prohibited. Violators of this regulation are subject to fine, and revocation of their shoreline use waterfowl blind permit.
- Licensed vehicles are permitted on the exposed lakebed in accordance with Corps policy. Rules and Regulations may be obtained by contacting the Corps office.
- No permanent blinds will be allowed West of Highway 183. Only boats and portable blinds that are removed daily will be allowed.
