## **NRRS™ Reservation services unavailable from Sept. 30 – Oct. 17**

**KANSAS CITY, MO.** – National Recreation Reservation Service (NRRS™) for the US Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) will not be available from Sept. 30, 2007 through Oct. 17, 2007.

The NRRS is converting to a new reservation system, due to this conversion, reservation services will not be available for USACE facilities beginning Midnight EST Sept. 30, 2007 through 10:00am EST Oct. 17<sup>th</sup>, 2007. This means that reservations, changes or cancellations will NOT be available through the call center or internet ([www.Recreation.gov](http://www.Recreation.gov)) during this time. Reservations will resume at 10:00am EST on Oct. 17<sup>th</sup> 2007.

If you do have an emergency that will prevent you from arriving for your stay during the above timeframe, please contact the Lake Project Office directly. It is advised that you make changes or new reservations, for the black out period, prior to Sept. 30, 2007 to limit any impact to your visit during this time. "Corps of Engineers operated Lakes that may have facilities impacted by the NRRS black out include, Harry S. Truman, Clinton, Harlan County, Melvern, Perry, Milford, Pomme de Terre, Stockton, Tuttle Creek, Kanopolis, Pomona, Rathbun, and Wilson Lakes. Please contact the individual Lake office for details" said David White of USACE.

Effective Oct. 17, 2007, the "advanced booking window" for all USACE facilities in the NRRS™ will change to a 6-month rolling window for individual family sites and cabins; group facilities will be on a 12 month rolling window. Please make note of this important change in the advanced booking window.
